BETHANY GOLDBLUM

Bethany L. Goldblum is the Director of the 2014 Public Policy and Nuclear Threats Bootcamp and Founder and Director of the Nuclear Policy Working Group at UC Berkeley, an interdisciplinary team of undergraduate and graduate students focused on developing policy solutions to strengthen global nuclear security. She also serves as the Director of Education for Nuclear Science and Security Consortium, a \$25M grant established by the National Nuclear Security Administration to train the next generation of nuclear security experts. Goldblum received a Ph.D. in Nuclear Engineering from the University of California, Berkeley in 2007. She served as a Clare Boothe Luce Chancellor's Postdoctoral Fellow at Berkeley before joining the nuclear engineering faculty at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville in August 2010. In January 2012, she returned to Berkeley as a member of the research faculty. Her research interests are in the areas of fundamental nuclear physics for nuclear security applications, nuclear-plasma interactions, scintillator characterization, and nuclear energy and weapons policy. From 2004-2006, she held the National Science Foundation Public Policy and Nuclear Threats Fellowship. She was a Project on Nuclear Issues Scholar at the Center for Strategic and International Studies and a member of the United States delegation to the 2008 China-India-United States Workshop on Science, Technology and Innovation Policy in Bangalore, India. She is author or co-author of over 45 scientific publications and presentations.
