The Public Policy & Nuclear Threats boot camps address important issues in nuclear policy while providing an understanding of the scientific foundations that inform them. Participants will learn from distinguished researchers, academics, policy officials, and operational specialists from leading universities, national laboratories, the International Atomic Energy Agency, and federal government agencies dealing with nuclear threats, detection sciences, nonproliferation strategies, energy policy, and other nuclear issues.
